# More to line up for jab as suspicion wears off

IPSWICH Hospital is preparing to give it's 1300-plus staff the swine flu vaccine in coming weeks while GPs expect their vaccine supplies to arrive today.

Hundreds of Ipswich residents have already had their vaccinations at specially set up clinics at the Ipswich Community Health Plaza, with plenty more expected each week.

West Moreton Health District Infection Prevention Service clinical nurse consultant Denise Noy said vaccinating staff at the hospital was a priority to ensure they did not catch or pass the flu on to patients.

"We're hoping to get as many staff vaccinated as quickly as we can," she said.

"A second wave of swine flu is expected, and could come as early as the summer or next year, so we need to be prepared."

She said the clinics set up in the Ipswich region to give the vaccinations would experience a jump in numbers once people saw their friends and family have the jab with no problems.

"I think initially some people might sit on the fence a bit because the vaccine has come out at short notice," she said.

"But after they see other people getting their vaccinations done I think we'll see more people coming to the clinics.

"It's just as safe and effective as the standard seasonal flu vaccine, so we encourage everyone to get their shots done."

Vaccination clinics have been set up at the Ipswich Community Health Plaza's Shop 101 Sexual Health Service room, the Springfield Super Clinic by appointment and at the Goodna Community Centre from next Tuesday.

Ipswich residents can also be vaccinated at many GP clinics around the region and if eligible, the GP consultation will be billed to Medicare. If not eligible, patients will have to pay the GP for their consultation but the vaccine will still be free.
